## KARIMJEE JIVANJEE FOUNDATION & YOUNG SCIENTISTS TANZANIA 2019

## November 2019

The Karimjee Jivanjee Foundation continued their support of the 9<sup>th</sup> Young Scientist Tanzania (YST) programme 2019, as the main co-sponsors.

The goal of YST is to raise the profile and standard of science education in secondary schools in Tanzania.

- 190 students participated nationwide (aged 13-22) from 79 schools in 27 regions of the country.
- 95 project ideas were shortlisted for the exhibition from a total of 326.
- During the 2019 programme, 144 teachers were trained during the outreach phase.

The programme culminated in a 2-day YST Exhibition and awards ceremony in Dar es Salaam in July, attended by VIPS (inc. Minister of Education, Science and Tech, Head of DFID), students, teachers and sponsors.

A **Hatim Karimjee Perpetua**l trophy, in memory of the ex KJF Chairman, Hatim Karimjee, was presented to John Mulishi and Stephen Kitomary for their project "A Digital Home Optimization System".
